Repentance is a change in direction, it is a turning around in our lives that is empowered by the Spirit. We turn away from sin and turn towards the God who gives us life.

Martin Luther famously said, "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent!' (Matt. 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Lent, as a season of repentance and renewal, is not an experience of despair but rather a way to meet God's grace again and again.



Flowers will be available to take home after the 10:30am Easter service.






EASTER CROSS


