

## **OUTREACH**

Mayflower outreach supports and partners with organizations through offering financial gifts, volunteering our time, and donating our space. Mayflower also sets aside a significant percentage of our annual budget for this outreach. As we live into Jesus' Great Commandment, these funds impact our community, our country, and our world.

## Outreach Partner Highlight: Comprehensive Therapy Center (CTC)



For the next 6 weeks we welcome 57 students and 36 volunteers from CTC to use Mayflower as a place to fulfill their mission. Established in 1982, CTC's mission is to meet the therapeutic and educational needs of adults and children with disabilities who are at-risk or disadvantaged, through skill building, academic enhancement and social emotional support.



## CTC's Objectives:

- To bring about positive change in clients' lives.
- To work with a variety of community agencies to assure high quality services for families.
- To coordinate activities with other agencies in the greater Grand Rapids area to meet the needs of families.

#### **CTC Serves**

- Our clinic serves children and adults with a primary diagnosis of mild to severe developmental disabilities or disabilities acquired in childhood who are physically, psychologically, and medically stable enough for an outpatient treatment model.
- We serve clients beginning at 18 months old.
- Families with children younger than 18 months are encouraged to call us for resources and connection or referral to community support, and we welcome them in our parent groups.
- Adults of any age are welcome, so long as they have a primary concern and primary diagnosis of a developmental disability or disability acquired in childhood rather than adult onset conditions.
- Clients with both developmental disabilities and adult onset concerns as the focus of care would benefit from another clinic; we are happy to coordinate with other agencies whenever possible.

## Outreach Partner Highlight: Women's City Club

The Grand Rapids Women's City Club has provided a community for women since 1924! The club regularly holds meetings in the Atrium at Mayflower. The club engages in community outreach, social events, enrichment opportunities and more. If you are interested in joining or would like more information, you are invited to join them for coffee time on the 3rd Tuesday of each month. They meet at various coffee shops around town or at East Congregational Church. These are casual get-togethers beginning at 10 am. Visit their website for dates and locations.

## Outreach Partner Highlight: Al-Anon

Mayflower provides a meeting place for Al-Anon members to meet on a weekly basis. Al-Anon Family Groups meet in over 130 countries to help families and friends of problem drinkers recover from the impacts of a loved one's drinking. Al-Anon is a mutual support program for people whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking. By sharing common experiences and applying the Al-Anon principles, families and friends of alcoholics can bring positive changes to their individual situations, whether or not the alcoholic admits the existence of a drinking problem or seeks help.


## WELCOME! We are so glad you joined us today!
