

MUSIC NOTES

"I've always loved carols" Vaughan Williams wrote to Cecil Sharp in 1911. He added that there was "something remarkable and quite unlike anything else about them.....I've always noticed what a peculiar atmosphere the major carol tunes have".

Fantasia on Christmas Carols was introduced by the composer at a Three Choirs Festival at Hereford in 1912. The Fantasia reflects Vaughan Williams' interest in both English folk songs and the soaring lines of Tudor music. In this work, Vaughan Williams deftly interweaves four beautiful English carols—The Truth From Above, The Somerset Carol, On Christmas Night, and There Is A Fountain, together with fragments of other well- known carols. After an introductory cello solo which has a narrative quality ('Once upon a time'— or should it be 'In the beginning was the Word'?), the solo baritone intones The truth sent from above accompanied by a wordless chorus, evocative of a wintry rural English landscape. After the more austere first carol Vaughan Williams introduces the more jovial Somerset Carol (Come all you worthy gentlemen), very much a variant on God rest you merry gentlemen, leading into a third section based on the Sussex Carol (On Christmas Night, all Christians sing). At the very end Vaughan Williams removes us from the high spirits of merry-making in a poignant blessing for unaccompanied chorus, and we are carried back across the snow-covered fields and away into the night. It is a moment of exquisite beauty.

Whereas the Fantasia begins with God's creation story and God's promise for us, the Bach/Kuhnau Cantata celebrates Jesus' birth. It begins with an orchestral sinfonia, followed by a chorus that states the overarching message of the work: "a child is born". In typical fashion, the soloists spin this universal message into a personal experience. The cantata ends with a joyful Alleluia, with an uninterrupted flow of 16th-notes accompanying the four-part chorale line. This Cantata was attributed to Bach in the late 19-th-century in the publication of his complete works. Later this attribution was questioned and it is now believed the probable composer is Johann Kuhnau, Bach's predecessor at St. Thomas Church in Leipzig.



THE TRIUNE GOD



O God of power and might, Creator of light and of darkness, of the earth and the stars, speak anew to Your people gathered to worship You and sing Your praise. Like Israel of old we wait in darkness, anticipating the Light who will dawn upon us and lift us from shadowy gloom into the glowing splendor of Your presence.
