Everyday Faith: Making the Ordinary Extraordinary by Growing and Serving in Community

Once we celebrate Pentecost on May 19, where are we heading? We will be entering what is known in the church year as *Ordinary Time*. While we hit the highs and lows of Jesus' life with a clear narrative from Advent through Pentecost (from anticipating Christ's birth to his nativity, ministry, suffering and death, resurrection, ascension and sending of the Spirit), the long season after Pentecost is not so well defined. How can we find excitement and purpose in this season when church attendance drops, choirs are on vacation, committees don't meet and other programs wait until fall?

Ordinary Time is sometimes referred to as Growing Time. In the northern hemisphere it coincides with summer months, a time of energy, renewal, transformation and growth. Vibrant green bursts forth in all of nature. What energy, renewal, transformation and growth can we bring to our individual lives, our families and our church community? What challenges and opportunities do these months present to us here at Mayflower? How can we turn Ordinary Time into Extraordinary Time?

As we enter this Ordinary Time, or this Growing Season, allow God to encourage others through you. Work actively to **restore broken relationships**. Give up things that divide your family and dedicate time to be present with those you love. **Be a blessing** to others by speaking words of life rather than criticism. **Inspire one another** and avoid burdening others with guilt. Take elements of your ordinary, daily life and engage them with intention, looking for the Sacred hidden within every moment and every person. **Take your everyday lives, routines, chores and see how the ordinary has the power to become extraordinary!**

As we prepare to grow and serve in community at Mayflower this summer, may our common prayer be:

Creator Redeemer Sustainer God,

Amen.

- How uncommon is the commonplace in Your Kingdom.
- The mundane is made miraculous, full of holy opportunities.
- The smallest joy a jubilee! The Nominating Committee is collecting committee/council nominations for 2025. Brief descriptions are listed below, more detailed descriptions are available at the welcome table. Nominations will be accepted by filling out a card at the welcome table, completing the Google form, using the QR code provided, or contacting the church office (616-459-6255). These will be voted on at our Annual Meeting held on June 9 following the service.

Christian Outreach Committee

Facilitates outreach in our community through word, deed, and resources.

Congregational Care Committee

Oversees sending cards to those on the prayer list, bringing meals to those in need, welcoming babies, and coordinating volunteers for the Sunday coffee reception.

Congregational Events Committee

Develops, organizes, and leads social events.

<u>Council</u>

Responsible for the overall operation, spiritual life, and financial health of the church.

Endowment Trust Board of Trustees

Oversees the Mayflower Endowment Fund, which is a separate entity established by MCC and is governed by a formal Trust Agreement.

Executive Committee

Acts on behalf of the Council between Council meetings. Advises the Council and the Senior Minister on all church personnel matters, and provides advice, wisdom, and support to the Moderator and Senior Pastor.

Finance Committee

Provides financial oversight of Church finances, develop the annual budget, monitor actual results and recommends needed adjustments to the budget to Council to keep MCC financially viable.

House and Grounds Committee

Maintains the church building and grounds in proper working order and aesthetically pleasing shape while meeting safety, security and stewardship goals.

Membership Committee

Supports current members of the church and actively works to promote the ministries of Mayflower to Sunday visitors and guests.

Nominating Committee

Recruits Council members and committee members and any other special committees as required.

Personnel Committee

Provides direction and decision making to Council for employee policies, compensation and benefits, legal compliance, performance management and staff training.

Worship and Music Committee

Coordinates various aspects of the worshipping life of the church fostering and supporting active, vital worship, and supports concerts and music outreach.

Youth Committee

Supports the children and youth ministries and the Mayflower staff who lead them.


Calling one and calling all to join our All Comer's Intergenerational Choir. To close out the choir season with a splash, we are inviting all to sing on June 9th.
