PRAY FOR OUR COUNTRY & OUR WORLD

May we take time to sit in silence and listen to the heart of God. In these troubling days, may we remember that God is a God of hope, joy, peace and love. We pray for peace not violence, hope to flourish, joy to sprout and love to triumph over hate.

We pray for peace in midst of division, strife, violence and war.

Our outreach partner, EFM, in Eastern Congo has lived and served in one of the most divided, violent and war-torn places on the globe. In this context, they have committed, in the name of Christ, to seek and sow peace. We recently received an update:

*With your support, seven days of Faith Restoration and Peace Building are already complete in Goma's Ndoso quarter, with Advanced Peace Building underway to form a new Community Peace Committee. In just two months, **39 church leaders from 11 churches—serving more than 2,750 congregants and thousands more of their neighbors—have been encouraged in their faith and equipped to prevent violent conflict.***

In the new year, we've continued Faith Restoration and Peace Building in the rural community of Kabale Katambi. We also launched a new pilot initiative to bring healing to women and girls who have suffered deep physical, spiritual, and emotional harm.

We are deeply encouraged by these results in just the first month of 2026 and look forward to sharing more in the months ahead.

Thank you for your continued generosity, and for holding the work of EFM Congo in your prayers. Your partnership makes this work possible. "Blessed are the peacemakers"!

2025 BUDGET SUMMARY

We saw great momentum with membership engagement and new member class participation. Pledge revenue and year end giving was up approximately \$70k from last year. Personnel and H&G expenses continue to rise which demonstrates our need for sustained long term growth. In 2025, we had a deficit budget of (\$53k) which we beat handily ending the year at +\$54k. In 2025, we had 187 giving units, while 195 are planned so far for 2026.




